Who We Are

he West Alabama Regional Commission (WARC) is one of the 12 regional councils in the State of Alabama. The councils serve local governments and citizens by coordinating region-wide projects and services, promoting cooperation among the local governments and carrying out state and federal programs on a regional basis. The West Alabama area is designated Planning District 2, or Region 2.

The WARC covers Bibb, Fayette, Greene, Hale, Lamar, Pickens and Tuscaloosa Counties. The commission is governed by an executive committee and a Board of Directors, made up of representatives from each of these seven counties and 35 municipalities, who annually elect a chairman and a vice-chairman. The Board is composed of citizens and policy-making elected officials from the member governments. It is with the Board's participation the WARC staff are enabled to carry out WARC's mission of improving the quality of life in West Alabama.



From Our Director

f 2021 had a theme, I am proud to say for WARC it would be **GROWTH**.

Kelli Kimbrell, Director of the Area Agency on Aging, has navigated her department with the addition of several new positions, and employees, seamlessly following the retirement of longtime director Pam McDaniel last November. Under Kelli's leadership, the Medicaid Waiver program scored a 100 on their NCQA three-year reaccreditation in August. The Community and Economic Development has played an integral role in the growth and success of several West Alabama communities. Cory Johnson, Director of CED, has worked tirelessly with her team to assist, administer and oversee the completion of grants, and the resulting projects, across our seven-county region. Her department has also aided these same communities, through a partnership with the University of Alabama and funding from the Economic Development Administration (EDA,) with the BETTER West Alabama Initiative. Transportation Planning is also under new leadership as Zane Davis was named director of the department last December. With the addition of a GIS Specialist in 2021, Transportation Planning is working within the local community to assist with GIS training for entities such as the Tuscaloosa County Parks and Recreation Authority (PARA). I am excited to be directing this growing team

and I look forward to the opportunities we as an

agency can bring to the West Alabama community in the upcoming year!

Area Agency on Aging (AAA)



During FY21, the AAA reached over 10,800 older adults and cargivers through various programs offered at the agency.

- The Aging & Disability Resource
 Center (ADRC) assisted more than
 2,800 individuals. Assistance includes
 screening, follow-up and enrollment
 into programs offered through the
 AAA and other providers in the region.
 Additionally, more than 4,100 "quick
 calls" were handled through ADRC.
 Marketing and outreach efforts
 reached more than 79,000 individuals.
- The Alabama Cares Program assisted more than 1,300 caregivers throughout the region
- The Medicaid Waiver Program served its highest number of clients to date - 965.
- The Nutrition/Senior Activity Program
 continued to serve clients despite
 numerous hardships caused by the
 pandemic. Centers were allowed to
 open to congregate settings in June
 2021 at the discretion of the contractor.
 Approximately 165,000 meals were
 served through the senior centers or
 home delivered meals over the past
 year.
- The State Health Insurance and Assistance Program (SHIP) has assisted more than 3,800 Medicare beneficiaries with their coverage questions and options. During the FY21 Open Enrollment Period (OEP), around 1,700 clients visited the AAA for unbiased counseling.

Community and Economic Development

- The Community & Economic Development
 Department launched a new initiative in 2021
 to support recovery and revitalization in our
 seven-county West Alabama region as we
 continue to navigate an economy altered by a
 global pandemic. The program, BETTER (Bringing
 Economic Tools To Enrich and Revitalize),
 explores the impacts in West Alabama while
 building capacity at all levels to strengthen the
 region and its municipalities. During the past
 year, a variety of BETTER activities brought us
 together despite the challenges of COVID-19
 including training for local leaders and clerks
 as well as action planning for counties and
 municipalities.
- The Community & Economic Development Department assisted local municipalities in the West Alabama region to receive and carry out grants totaling \$4,317,178. The department has submitted additional requests during FY21 totaling \$943,429 that are under review and pending approval.
- The Grant and Loan Guide for Local Governments in West Alabama and the West Alabama Mining and Manufacturing Directory were updated and posted to www.warc.info during 2021.
- The Division C Mitigation Plan and the Northwest Alabama Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan - Div. E have been completed. WARC and the Alabama Tombigbee Regional Commission prepared the 10-county Division C plan which includes Bibb, Greene, Hale, Pickens and Tuscaloosa counties; and WARC assisted the Northwest Alabama Council of Local Governments with the 7-county Division E plan that includes Lamar County.
- The Town of Gordo was awarded Appalachian Regional Commission (ARC) funds in the amount of \$163,484 to replace and upgrade three sewer lift stations.
- The Hale County Commission was awarded \$200,000 from the Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs Community Development Block Grant-CV (ADECA CDBG-CV) fund to purchase an ambulance.
- The Pickens County Commission was awarded \$300,000 from the ADECA CDBG-CV fund to construct an EMA climate-controlled storage facility with space for the Pickens County Coroner to operate.

FY21 Highlights from the BETTER West Alabama Initiative


BETTER sponsored nine elected officials and staff to attend the annual AARC Training Conference held virtually in 2020.

Local West Alabama leaders attended a regional leadership training program sponsored by BETTER in partnership with the University of Alabama Center for Economic Development.

BETTER W AL sponsored 17 West Alabama clerks to attend sessions offered by the Municipal Clerk's Institute.

BETTER ACTION PLANNING for counties and municipalities will be completed in 2021.

Transportation Planning



Transportation Planning created new, interactive web maps including regional traffic counts, safety observations, and a county features map hub.



- The Tuscaloosa Area Metropolitan
 Planning Organization (MPO) approved
 seven new projects to be funded by the
 MPO program (Surface Transportation
 Attributable Funding). The seven
 projects were located in the City of
 Northport and City of Tuscaloosa
 totaling \$14,382,532.
- The West Alabama Rural Planning
 Organization (RPO) adopted
 its Long-Range Transportation
 Plan -2021. This marks the fourth RPO
 LRTP developed by the West Alabama
 Regional Commission since 2006.
- The WARC Transportation Planning Department Department has began the process of providing contract-redistricting assistance following the release on the 2020 Census data.
- For the third year, the WARC
 Transportation Planning Department provided contract-GIS service for the City of Northport.
- The Tuscaloosa Area MPO and West Alabama RPO adopted the West Alabama Coordinated Public Transit Plan 2021 Report.
- The WARC Transportation Planning
 Department contracted with Tuscaloosa
 Parks and Recreation Authority (PARA)
 to provide GIS training.
- The WARC Transportation Planning
 Department contracted with the town
 of Vance to GPS and map their sewer
 system. WARC also mapped fire hydrant
 locations and updated the zoning map.
 In addition to paper maps, interactive
 web maps were also created.
